# Here to Stay Capital Campaign

>>> The Here to Stay capital campaign is made up of three phases:

Phase I – "Acquisition" (purchase of the building) – fully funded and complete!

Phase II – "Accessibility" (improving the accessibility of the building) – fully funded and complete!

Phase III – "Expansion" (transforming unused space in current building into usable program space) – has begun and currently fundraising

### >>> PHASE I & II COMPLETED!

As many of you are aware, Grace Center initiated a one-million-dollar capital campaign back in 2015 with the goal of acquiring the 11,000-square-foot property we had been leasing since 2006.

Now, as we look at today, we have achieved a significant milestone by successfully completing the down payment, securing the building through bridge financing, completely retiring the debt, and improving the accessibility of the building, thus completing Phases I and II! This remarkable accomplishment has been made possible through the effectiveness of grant writing and the incredible generosity of many individuals within our community.

Owning our building gives us the luxury to remodel and update certain areas, allow implementation of new programs, and accommodate growth in the number of participants and staff without the concern of having to frequently renegotiate lease terms or possibly relocate at another time. This is a critical time in the history of Grace Center as an aging population will dictate an ever-increasing demand for our services.

Now that we have reached Phase III, we are excited to be transforming unused space into more specifically designed program areas. Our first endeavor is to create a life-skills area with a kitchen and cooking skills demonstration setup. We hope to create this space using workbenches that can be easily stowed away so that other skills like laundry and wood-working can continue to be learned in the same area.

We have applied for funding through community grants to take care of this, but we always appreciate your support, and we kindly ask for your donation to help us reach our goals for Phase III of the Here to Stay Capital Campaign. The support we receive from community members like you is vital in enabling our non-profit organization to maintain the high-quality care that our families, friends, neighbors, and community members require and deserve.

#### OLIVIA MCFADDEN, PROGRAM ASSISTANT




#### MOYA DUNCAN, COMMUNITY OUTREACH & ENGAGEMENT COORDINATOR
