Jane's Piano

Donated in 2009 by Carol Alexander and her family, Jane's Piano, a 1904 Chickering baby grand, serves as a centerpiece in the lobby of Grace Center. Since then, participants and volunteers have delighted in playing its ivory keys, filling the halls of Grace Center with their passion for music.

The story of Jane's piano begins one hundred and eleven years ago, in 1914, when the baby grand piano came into the possession of Jane's mother, Zelma Fletcher, a music teacher in the quaint farming town of Malvern, Iowa. Zelma instilled a profound appreciation for music in her students, the local community, and her two daughters, Jane and Lorraine. Jane's enduring connection with the piano ignited when she was just three years old. Throughout her childhood, she dedicated three hours each day to practice.

The piano emerged as a vital source of income during the challenging times of the Great Depression following Jane's father's departure. Jane dedicated her mornings and evenings to practice, while the daylight hours were reserved

for Zelma's students, as she worked hard to provide for her daughters. ane and her sister both attended college, which was primarily funded by the piano and its students. Jane earned her BA in music and married her lifelong partner, Alex. Throughout her college years and early marriage, the baby grand piano stayed with Zelma. Jane opted for a less cherished piano to maintain her daily practice all while managing her teaching responsibilities and raising three children. In 1950, Jane was joyfully reunited with her cherished friend, the Chickering baby grand piano, which stayed with her for the rest of her life. She played her beloved piano daily until just a week before she, peacefully departed.

In honor of her memory, Jane's family generously donated the piano to Grace Center, where she had many happy moments.
